Dental Council of Hong Kong Restoration to General Register

Guidance Notes

If you wish to have your name restored to the General Register, you may apply for restoration by completing the attached application form. You may wish to note the followings:-

A. Filling in Application Form

- indicate on the application form whether you wish to restore your name to the Resident List or Non-resident List of the General Register.
- indicate correctly the date of removing your name from the General Register.
- your name shown on the application form should be the one previously appeared on the General Register.
- the address shown on the application form must be
 - (i) your up-to-date practising address in Hong Kong if you apply for restoration to the **Resident List**; or
 - (ii) your corresponding address in Hong Kong if you apply for restoration to the **Non-resident List**.
- the application form must be accompanied by a statutory declaration (please refer to Note 1 on the application form).

B. Items/Documents to support your application

- a notarized copy of your HKID Card/passport.
- completed Data Form (attached).
- original Certificate of Registration.
- one recent passport-size photograph.
- a crossed cheque or banker's draft of the following amounts* made payable to "The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region" or "The Government of HKSAR".

Restoration to the Resident List

HK\$2,645* (HK\$2,090 *being restoration fee and HK\$555* being annual fee for a dentist residing and practising in Hong Kong).

Restoration to the Non-resident List

HK\$2,090 (being restoration fee).

- Certificate of Good Standing if you have practised dentistry outside Hong Kong since your name was removed from the General Register (please refer to Note 2 on the application form).
- details of criminal and/or professional proceedings, if any. (please refer to Note 3 on the application from).

C. Others

• If the name shown on any supporting document, e.g. the Certificate of Good Standing and HKID Card/passport, is different from your previously registered name, you are required to make a further declaration before a Notary Public or Commissioner for Oath as appropriate to clarify that all the different names refer to your good self.

The information on the Gazette should contain the name, registered addresses, qualifications and dates of qualifications of each dentist. Since it is required that the Gazette has to be printed in both Chinese and English, the names and addresses of the list of registered dentists are required to be provided in Chinese where applicable, in addition to the English version.

Statement of Purposes

Purpose of Collection

1. The personal data are provided by dental practitioners to the Dental Council for the purpose of facilitating the provisions of the Dentists Registration Ordinance (Cap. 156, Laws of Hong Kong). The provision of personal data is obligatory under the same Ordinance.

Classes of Transferees

2. The personal data you provide are mainly for use within the Dental Council but they may also be disclosed to other Government branches/departments, agencies or authorities for the purposes mentioned in paragraph 1 above, if required. The Public can access to your gazette information relating to names, addresses, qualifications and dates of the qualifications. Apart from this, your other personal particulars and information will only be disclosed to parties where you have given consent to such disclosure or where such disclosure is allowed under the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance.

Access to personal Data

3. You have a right of access and correction with respect to personal data as provided for in sections 18 and 22 and Principle 6 of Schedule 1 of the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance. Your right of access includes the right to obtain a copy of your personal data provided by you during the occasions as mentioned in paragraph 1 above. A fee may be imposed for complying with a data access request.

Note to Applicants

Waiver of Registration and Related Fees for Healthcare Professionals

As a token of appreciation to healthcare professionals in the fight against coronavirus disease-2019, the fees payable in respect of statutory registration / enrolment as well as issuance and/or renewal of practising certificates for 13 healthcare professions that take effect during the 3-year concession period from 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2023 will be waived by the Government if certain criteria are met.

2. Pursuant to <u>Dentists (Fee Concessions) Regulation 2020</u>, the fees payable for the first time registration in the General Register and Specialist Register and <u>the issuance and/or renewal of practising certificates</u> for up to 3 times that first take effect during the concession period will be waived.

The Dental Council of Hong Kong
